

Assignments

The following is a summary of the assignments you will be required to turn in during the course of the History in the Heartland program. See the handout for each assignment for more detailed instructions.

Primary Source Activity Assignment

You will create **SIX** classroom activities focused on getting students to analyze primary sources. **Four** of these activities must relate to the History in the Heartland core themes. These themes are general and the relationship can be broad, especially if the topic is somewhat outside your usual curriculum. Turn in the assignments in digital form so that a selection of these can be easily posted to the project website.

Due dates: THREE (3) by February 24 ; last THREE (3) by May 5

Using Primary Sources in the Classroom

You will fill out a short worksheet documenting that you used **TWO** of the above assignments in the Classroom. **Due dates: February 24, May 5**

Ohio Memory Scrapbook Assignment

For this assignment you will create your own online scrapbook on Ohio Memory. The Ohio Memory Project is an online scrapbook of Ohio history, consisting of over 23,000 digitized images of primary sources held by archives, libraries, museums, and historical societies throughout Ohio.
